# Structure and Organisation

# Organisation

The organisation is a charitable company limited by guarantee, incorporated on 29<sup>th</sup> July 2002 and registered as a charity on 2<sup>nd</sup> December 2003, it took over the work of an unincorporated charity which commenced its work in 1992. The company was established under a Memorandum and Articles of Association and amended by special resolution on 27<sup>th</sup> July 2003. The Memorandum of Association established the objects and powers of the charitable company which is governed in accordance with its Articles of Association. In the event of the company being wound up members are required to contribute an amount not exceeding £10. The charity is managed by the Trustees who meet at intervals throughout the year to consider the progress of the charity and to consider its future direction and activities. The day-to-day operation of the charity is delegated to the Executive Officer who is supported by other trustees and by staff and volunteers.

# **Trustee Appointments**

The Trustees are appointed by the members in the Annual General Meeting, each year one third of the Trustees retire by rotation but are eligible to stand for reelection. All trustees are inducted into the policies and procedures of the charity to ensure they are well equipped to fulfil their duties. The current Trustees would like to place on record their appreciation for the contributions of the Trustees who retired during the year.

# **Related Organisations**

The charity is grateful for the support which it receives from churches which are members of the Connexion of Independent Methodist Churches. Whilst there are no formal links the charity is conscious of the generous support received over many years.

## **Risk Management**

The Trustees have conducted their own review of the major risks to which the charity is exposed and systems have been established to mitigate those risks.

# **Objectives and Activities**

## **Charitable Objects**

The charity's objects are to provide support, care, comfort and temporary accommodation for people in greatest need.

The charity aims to fulfil its objectives by "soup kitchens" for homeless and needy people within the North East of England and in particular the conurbations on Tyneside and Teesside. By earning the trust of the people that the kitchens serve the charity seeks to refer to other agencies, as appropriate, for further advice, support and assistance to rebuild shattered lives.

## Achievements and Performance

# **Review of the Period**

2007 has been a very busy year for the North East Help Link with seven kitchens serving approximately 500 meals and 700 drinks every week to some of the neediest people in the North East, this is twice the number being served in 2006. In the year over 26,000 meals have been provided free of charge to those the Charity is seeking to help. Many different people are helped each week and of those about half are living rough on the streets. It is a sad reflection of the times in which we live that there have been so many new faces over this year. However, it has been particularly encouraging to help some to return to their homes and families before they become established in a life on the streets. Others have been helped to find accommodation and medical assistance in their journey towards rebuilding their lives.

The work of the charity in gaining the trust and confidence of the homeless has been recognised by government agencies which have used the bus as a meeting point to help people to access benefits.

As a result of the practical expression of God's love through the staff and volunteers several of those helped have begun to attend churches.

The membership scheme established in 2006 has grown and the trustees continue to hope to build upon it in the future. A Thanksgiving Service was combined with the Annual Meeting and a thanksgiving meeting was also held in the North West of England. Although the attendance at both meetings was lower than had been anticipated they were good meetings in which the staff were able to report on their work directly to supporters. The meetings were both inspiring and challenging.

The Trustees have been delighted to accept the offer of a talented volunteer who has designed and maintains a website for the Charity. The website allows the charity to provide continuously updated information to those interested in the work. The same volunteer has also produced a DVD that provides an introduction and review of the work of the Charity. The Trustees are grateful for the enthusiasm with which these tasks have been undertaken.

Improving communication with members and supporters was one of the aims set by the Trustees for 2007. Thanks to the efforts of George Carlyon regular newsletters have been distributed in 2007 and the Trustees are continuing to look at further ways to improve communications.

The Trustees would like to take this opportunity to thank the individuals, Churches and trusts that have given generously, allowing this important work to continue. In particular Sainsbury's ( $\pounds$ 200 and food), the Ballinger Charitable Trust ( $\pounds$ 1,000), the Hedley Denton Charitable Trust ( $\pounds$ 250), the Albert Hunt Trust ( $\pounds$ 2,000) and the Barbour Trust ( $\pounds$ 1,000).

# Achievements and Performance (Continued)

## **Financial Review**

At  $31^{st}$  December 2007 the charity was reliant on personal loans having expended more resources than it had. The Trustees are conscious of the need to find sufficient ongoing funding to support the work of the charity and to this end engaged the services of a professional fundraiser to assist them in achieving this aim. This has resulted in donations of £4,250 being received from trusts within the year and a further £3,500 up to the date of this report.

The trustees have also been encouraged by an increase in unsolicited donations of finance, food and clothing and have managed to maintain spending at similar levels to those in the previous year. Thus there has been a significant reduction in the deficit for the year and the Trustees hope to have no deficit in the years to come.

## **Volunteer Support**

The charity is reliant on the support of its volunteers to achieve its objectives. The work of volunteers is invaluable.

## Gifts in Kind

The charity continues to receive practical gifts of food, clothing and bedding from churches and individuals. It is not possible to measure the value of these gifts to the charity. It is a reflection of the increasing number of homeless people served by the charity that, despite the continued receipt of these gifts, the cost of food to the charity has increased. The Trustees wish to express their thanks to Sainsbury's at Washington for the regular donations of food and for allowing a "bag pack" at the store.

## **Plans for Future Periods**

Our aims for 2008:

- 1. To continue to operate at least seven kitchens each week.
- 2. To secure funding to meet the current year's expenditure and to begin to build a small reserve.
- 3. To continue to investigate the possibility of a drop in centre in Sunderland.
- 4. To recruit new volunteers and trustees to share in the work of the charity.
- 5. To further improve communication with the charity's supporters.

## **Reserves Policy**

The charity is currently in deficit and therefore the Trustees are taking steps to address this as outlined above. The trustees would like to establish cash reserves equal to three months operating expenditure when the current funding situation is addressed.

## **Responsibilities of the Trustees**

# Notes to the accounts

# **1** Accounting policies

In preparing the accounts the following accounting policies have been complied with:

- a) The accounts have been prepared on the historic cost convention and in accordance with the Companies Act 1985, the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP), "Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice" published in March 2005 and applicable accounting standards.
- b) Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity.
- c) Restricted funds are subjected to restrictions on their expenditure imposed by the donor or through the terms of an appeal.
- d) All incoming resources are included in the statement of financial activities when the charity is entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy. The following specific policies are applied to particular categories of income:
  - i) Voluntary income is received by way of grants, donations and gifts and is included in full in the statement of financial activities when receivable. Grants, where entitlement is conditional on the delivery of a specific performance by the charity, are recognised when the charity becomes unconditionally entitled to the grant.
  - ii) Donated services and facilities are included at the value to the charity where this can be quantified. The value of services provided by volunteers has not been included in these accounts.
  - iii) Investment income is included when receivable.
- e) Expenditure is recognised on an accruals basis as a liability is incurred. Expenditure includes any VAT which cannot be fully recovered, and is reported as part of the expenditure to which it relates:
  - i) Costs of generating funds comprise costs associated with attracting voluntary income, including costs of trading for fundraising purposes and the use of a professional fundraiser.
  - ii) Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries. It includes costs that can be allocated directly to such activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support them.
  - iii) Governance costs include those costs associated with meeting the constitutional and statutory requirements of the charity and include the costs linked to the strategic management of the charity.
  - iv) All costs are allocated between the expenditure categories of the statement of financial activities on a basis designed to reflect the use of the resource. Costs relating to a particular activity are allocated directly, others are apportioned on an appropriate basis as set out in the notes.

# 2 Taxation

The charity is exempt from taxation on its income and gains where they are applied for charitable purposes.
